Barry Solof writes about his father, **Irving Solof '49**, who passed away in 2008. He always spoke fondly of his days at Rutgers and he was very appreciative of the support of ZBT. He didn't think he would have made it to graduation without the help of ZBT. His folks had come from Europe on a boat in the early part of the last century and he was the first in the family to make it through college. It was a very big deal to get his education and he was always grateful for the opportunity.

David Hoffman '64 passed away untimely on March 1st, 2009. His wife, Pauline, says donations in his memory can be made to the Englewood Hospital Hospice in NJ or the ASPCA. Recent alumni appreciated Dave's occasional presence at the Chapter house, as well as the pool table that he made sure was donated to its use, even if it required a number of us to carry it on our backs up Union Street. The pool table was lost a few years back. We're sad to lose David as well.

We were informed by Linda Rosenwasser that her husband, **Bruce Rosenwasser '75**, passed away back on March 11, 2008. He really enjoyed his Rutgers years and the ZBT fraternity and frequently spoke of the fun he had with his fraternity brothers. For twenty years and at the time of his death Bruce was owner and operator of Ideal Clothing in Hammonton, NJ, a women's sportswear and evening/prom wear store. Ideal was one of the first freestanding, discount fashion stores in New Jersey that was built in the 1940's. Bruce transformed Ideal into an outstanding prom and sportswear destination store and took it from the highway to the superhighway of the internet in 2003, starting Idealclothing.net which continues on today under new ownership as does the store. The jingle for our store is one of the most recognized in the Delaware Valley area.
